### **Overview of Initiative**

\$50 million initiative over five years

12 Bay Area Koret University Partners

Key program areas:

- 1) Koret Scholars
- 2) Capital grants
- 3) Recruiting, advising, and support for underserved populations
- 4) Strengthen ties between Bay Area universities and Israeli scholars

Support for Koret Scholars:

- 1) Support for undergraduate, graduate, and post-doctoral scholars
- 2) Programs at 11 universities
- 3) 1,500+ scholars

**Examples of programs among those supported by the respective grants for each institution are listed below.**

#### **City College of San Francisco: \$1,000,000**

- To improve access to college resources through enhanced web technology
- For increased campus security measures

#### **Notre Dame de Namur University: \$1,000,000**

- For the capital campaign to save Ralston Hall

#### **Santa Clara University: \$2,000,000**

- For support of the LEAD Scholars and Koret Scholars programs
- To support increased academic success of first-generation and underrepresented students in STEM disciplines

#### **San Francisco State University: \$2,000,000**

- For capital support of the Student Advising and Learning Center (SALC)
- To support the SF Junior Giants Urban Youth Academy Family Project by providing college preparation workshops to their parents and guardians

**San Jose State University: \$2,000,000**

- For a new student information analytics system
- For support of the Spartan Scholars Program to increase retention and graduation of underrepresented and first-generation students

**Sonoma State University: \$1,000,000**

- For the expansion of the Provost's Undergraduate Research Grants
- For new technology enhanced learning spaces

**Stanford University: \$10,000,000**

- For support of the Koret Young Israeli Scholars program
- For capital support of the Neuroscience and ChEM-H research complex

**University of California, Davis: \$6,000,000**

- For the expansion of the Special Transitional Enrichment Program (STEP) for engineering and computer science transfer students
